Through their unique blend of skill-building experiences, social activities and personalized support, young adults with developmental disabilities can move into a home of their own, maintain a competitive -wage job, and build peer friendships.

Community Housing Network – This organization provides homes for people in need through proven strategies of homelessness prevention, housing assistance, development of affordable housing, community education and advocacy. They carry out their work in primarily southeast Michigan.


